Data **cleanse**

During spring/summer 2023, our Data Administrator undertook a database cleanse of the personal information held on the Neighbourhood Alert system.

All of our 1,700 Coordinators throughout Scotland were contacted to ensure database accuracy and GDPR compliance. We would like to thank all of those who responded and got in touch.

The data cleanse work is now complete and the database has been updated accordingly to reflect current membership. Any information relating to Watches that are no longer in existence, or where no responses were tendered, have now been removed in keeping with GDPR legislation. However, this means that a total of 1,034 Watches have been deleted from the system. Many of the Coordinators from these Watches remain on the Alert system, as registered Alert users.




Please note that if you believe your Watch has been removed, but is actually still active, please contact us and we can have this reinstated for you.

We now have 614 watches registered on the Neighbourhood Alert system.




Festive Activity 2023
