We are delighted and excited to be working alongside the SFRS and look forward to further enhancing our service to members and their communities on safety and wellbeing over the coming months.

Summer is a time of fun and relaxation whether we spend it with friends and family at home or away at our destination of choice. But some simple proactive measures will help ensure that we can do this safely and with peace of mind.

Home Security system – do you have one? If you do make sure it is 'fit for purpose' and in good working order to keep your home safe when you are away. If not, there are a range of options for you to consider in accordance with your budget with simple additions to home security available at low cost such as a doorbell with CCTV facility. Indoor and outdoor CCTV may be a consideration for you.

Windows and Doors – check the integrity of all windows and doors to

ensure that they are fully functional and secure. Remember to lock all windows and doors when you are out and about – never leave your home insecure.

Garden security – keep your hedges trimmed to prevent them from screening any potential housebreakers from accessing your property. Always put garden tools and ladders away securely and lock your shed/outhouses. The use of shed alarms and CCTV to cover blind spots are great additions to garden security.

Welcome to our news-in-brief. In this update page, we'll keep you informed about the latest developments and important updates from the NWS team.

Stay Safe - Get on Board Anti-Fraud Roadshow

During March NWS supported officers from the Police Scotland Crime Reduction Unit as part of their 'Stay Safe – Get on Board Anti-Fraud Roadshow,' alongside partners from British Transport Police (BTP), Police Scotland Edinburgh Prevention, Intervention and Partnerships and the ScotRail Travel Safe Team. The group travelled on the east coast trainlines between Inverness and Tweedbank, holding roadshows at the stations located in Aberdeen, Edinburgh, and Dundee with a final stop at Galashiels Interchange.

This roadshow enabled us to connect with over 1000 passengers. BTP highlighted the text service 61016 and promoted the Railway Guardian App, which allows users to report crimes or concerns on the rail network, as well as providing access to news, guides, or supports.

North East Crime Reduction Officers provided advice on Fraud and NWS staff NWS Staff highlighted the benefits of getting involved in the Community, providing advice on Neighbourhood Watch Schemes and the Neighbourhood Alert system.

Lesley Clark, (NWS Director) said: "We are proud to be involved in this joint initiative. Crime including fraud and other community safety issues can have a devastating impact on people and communities involved.

By working together, providing advice and support it is hoped people will feel more informed and better at identifying crimes and prevent them becoming a victim.

The team joined officers from Police Scotland Edinburgh Prevention, Intervention and Partnerships, the National Rural & Acquisitive Crime Unit, and Business Crime Prevention Unit, as well as colleagues from Trading Standards, Age Scotland, and ACE IT Scotland.

This event was the final opportunity for officers (serving and retired) to visit the building in this way and see photographs and displays highlighting the 50 years of its policing history.



'Improving Lives' event, Clydebank

On 23rd April, NWS was privileged to attend an event organised by the Improving Lives team at Dalmuir Barclay Church in Clydebank. Over 50 different organisations attended and engaged with members of the public, including those living with disabilities and the carers who provide care and support to people in the community. The event was an excellent opportunity to learn more about the many ways in which organisations are working together to support those living in the Clydebank and greater Glasgow area.

Many of the attendees were interested to hear about what NWS do and several were keen to sign up to the Neighbourhood Alert system.

On Thursday 30th May NWS staff attended the event by Voluntary Action South Ayrshire that took place within Ayr Town Hall.

Are you ready?

Post and deliveries - Take measures to prevent papers, parcels, and letters from being left visible at your door highlighting to callers that you are away from home.

> Redirect, if necessary or ask a neighbour to help keep an eye out for vou.



Social media - be careful what you post about your holiday plans and where you are when out and about, especially if you permit public access. Be mindful that you could be advertising the fact that you are away from home to potential thieves. Consider changing public privacy settings for the time that you are away and restrict access to those you trust.



In/Out? Make it look as though you are still at home by using light timers for both indoor and outdoor lights.

Tilted blinds are great to prevent people from seeing inside your home. Keep valuables out of sight and use a home safe for more precious items.

Tips: Summer sun and hot weather



Getting out and about in Scotland – if you plan to benefit from the outdoors in hot weather remembers to be prepared with sunscreen, hat, lightweight clothes and take along adequate food and water. The Scot Govt website give good practical advice on keeping safe including information on forest fires and the outdoor access code. It goes without saying - Plan your visit and know your route beforehand. Let others know where you are going and when you plan to be back. More info



Barbeque safety – remember best practice when gilling - be careful where you site your BBQ, keep children at a safe distance and allow to cool before disposing of coal and ash. More info
